This is to inform you that the above application for advance permission to return to unrelinquished domicile under Section 212(c) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, as amended, which was filed with this office on [REDACTED] , has been approved. This approval only covers the basis of inadmissibility set forth on the application. The specific grounds of inadmissibility set forth on the application are waived in perpetuity. The applicant does not need to apply for a waiver under section 212(c) of the Act for any future travel abroad unless subsequent grounds of inadmissibility arise. If subsequent grounds of inadmissibility do arise, a new application must be submitted to the district director having jurisdiction over the applicant's place of residence. If the applicant is found otherwise admissible, the applicant's admission to the U.S. is authorized under section 212(c) of the Act, as amended, each time the applicant returns to the U.S. The applicant should show this notice to the U. S. Immigration Officer each time the applicant returns to the U. S. If the applicant has questions about the conditions of this approval, he or she should contact the nearest U. S. consulate.
